Minutes of the Council meeting held on 16th September 2019 at 7:30pm at Bisham Abbey.

Public Forum

One Member of the Public expressed concern about the impact of the temporary flood defence in the Orchard, on residents of The Green.

One Member of the Public asked about the clearance of the stream. JC advised that TD would be covering these issues during item 80.

One Member of the Public raised an issue with deer crossing the road in Burchetts Green and asked about the possibility of a warning sign.

One Member of the Public raised concerns about overgrown hedgerows in Burchetts Green, making it difficult to navigate the footpaths.

One Member of the Public complained about speeding vehicles on Burchetts Green road, often coming from the higher speed limits at either end of the road.

One member of the Public raised an issue with a marquee on the grounds of Hurley House Hotel which has been in place since May 2018, specifically mentioning the proximity to their property and the frequency of events there causing noise. AK responded that he supported the objections of the neighbours, and cited a rule that marquees are allowed for a cumulative period of 28 days throughout the year without planning permission.

ACTION – BM to report to RBWM to investigate terms of licensing for live events, and existence of marquee.

One Member of the Public reported that there was a strong smell of sewage close to Hurley House Hotel, and suggested there may be an issue with the drains.

Item 179 – AK gave an update on the meeting with the Public Rights of Way (PRoW) Officer. RBWM had made a decision on the route of footpath 13 based on the limited documentation available, citing that the legal route runs along the western edge, regardless of actual route taken. Any legal process would be lengthy and complex. AK suggested leaving issue to the Ramblers as they have significant experience in this type of activity. GW stated that it would become an issue if an incoming land-owner decided not to honour the agreement to allow the footpath to cross their land. PRoW will connect with the incoming landowner.

Item 180 – MRB suggested that letter to farmers was too confrontational and asked for it to be redrafted.

AK reported that the historic Milestone on the A404 is overgrown.

79) Parish land

AK suggested that the "wild flower" patch at the front of the Orchard was looking overgrown, and recommended revisiting the Orchard Management Plan

ACTION – BM to organise a meeting with Braywick in November

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80) Flooding

TD gave a presentation on the temporary Flood Barrier project, highlighting the potential impacts on different areas of the village, and the mitigation strategies in place.

One Member of the Public said that on previous occasions, sandbags had been slow to arrive, negating their effectiveness. TD explained that sandbag distribution was now a part of the EA's strategy, and sandbags would be delivered by them.

AK asked about the responsibilities of the EA operatives to liaise with local residents during deployment of flood measures. TD responded that Community Information Officers would be on site, likely during daylight hours.

GW asked whether it was possible to keep a store of sandbags locally to speed up deployment. TD explained that, as they were only ever used as an emergency measure, it was not something that would have permanent logistics or facilities.

Cllr Brar asked bout people with mobility issues, or infirmity, and how they would lay sandbags. TD said that EA operatives would places the sandbags on The Green, in the event of deploying the temporary flood defence.

One Member of the Public mentioned that the cottages on The Green have no foundations, with water ingress happening through the ground, and asked about potential solutions. TD explained that any interventions have to go through a cost/benefit analysis before they can be developed.

One Member of the Public asked how long the stream has been under EA management. TD explained that the stream is classed as a Main River, and as a result has been in the EA's remit since 1996. The EA is responsible for management plans, but the land owner is responsible for maintenance.

TD explained that the EA want to work with the Council to make sure there is a management plan in place. AK explained that the council was very keen for this to happen and asked for specific roles and responsibilities. TD said that a Tutorial Team would be visiting the Council in August to clarify works needed.

MRB asked about what happens if a landowner neglects to maintain the watercourse. TD explained that enforcement can be costly, but the EA can put pressure on landowners to discharge their duties

81) Finance

BM gave an update on current financial position, highlighting that the Council had £10,138.19.

82) Community Infrastructure Levy

BM reported on a meeting with RBWM CIL lead officer.

83) Poppy Appeal

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Cllrs asked to be supplied with three wreathes; two infilled and one with a hollow centre.

84) Bisham Abbey

MRB gave a report on the disrepair of the Clock Tower.

GW believes that active work is taking place due to the scaffold around the tower. MRB had been informed that scaffolding was there for safety purposes, and the work would be done "at some point".

ACTION – BM to speak to Bisham Abbey for information about the Clock Tower works.
