### Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held on 21st March 2022 at 7:30pm in Bisham Abbey

#### **Attendees**

Councillors: Cllr Jim Cooke (JC) (Chair), Cllr Alan Keene (AK), Cllr Derek Oliver (DO), Cllr Mandy Robson Brown (MRB), Cllr Ged Wylie (GW).

#### **Public Forum**

One Member of the Public reported that local resident Brian Dormer had passed away.

One Member of the Public asked the council for a Jubilee Lunch on the slipway, with potential access to the school. The Cllrs were supportive of the idea.

One Member of the Public reported that they were concerned about two dead ash trees in the Orchard. BM agreed to get the tree surgeon to look at the trees and provide a cost for removal.

One Member of the Public wanted to update the Council on the proposed Stubbings recycling site. The plant has been changed from Grade 1 (Green waste) to Grade 2 (Industrial waste). RBWM have contravened their own Permitted Development ruling which noted that no site under two hectares is viable for a recycling site, but the planned site is 1.2 hectares.

AK asked about progress of the Local Plan. Cllr Brar confirmed that it was passed in February.

One Member of the Public reported that Littlecroft was in a state of disrepair, referring to the history of Planning applications from the owners, and believes that both parties should engage to develop a suitable solution.

One Member of the Public thanked Colin Lemmings for clearing leaves from the Green.

James Stevenson (JS) from the Woodland Trust gave an update on the Ice House, and discussed future maintenance, which he believes BPC have responsibility towards. BPC have access to the Ice House but not maintenance responsibility.

One Member of the Public asked why the footpath between the A308 and Winter Hill road has been closed, noting that the reduction in parking has made overall access to the woods difficult.

One Member of the Public noted that some local residents had restricted access to the woods, including wire stretched across pathways, which the police were aware of.

JS reported that some of the parking had been moved due to an increase in Anti-Social Behaviour, which was causing difficulties for local residents. JS also noted that the lane in question was a private road, with a right of access for local properties, and is not in WT's remit.

JS highlighted the difficulties on Dungrove Hill, which he believes to be a dangerous junction with the A404 and wanted to look at potential solutions.

AK noted that stopping up the end of the lane at the A404 junction would likely lead to an increase in ASB, fly-tipping etc.

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Cllr Brar asked if it was possible to have a site meeting to look at the issues.

One Member of the Public asked if the WT had a responsibility to provide access to the woodland. JS responded that the WT were not obligated to provide parking but works to make access as safe as possible.

One Member of the Public noted that it was a shame that there was no access to the woods from Bisham without a car.

JS reported that WT were happy to work with local landowners with undesignated and unwooded areas with a view to increasing parking provision. DO noted that a conversation with Longridge would be beneficial.

MRB highlighted that the parking area on Grubwood Lane was marked as a public car park on Google Maps. JS noted that the area in question was National Trust land, and WT were dealing with the rangers on various issues. NT have a small car park that WT will be sharing going forward.

AK reported on his attendance of the installation of the new vicar in Stubbings.

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### 145. Highways Matters

GW noted that the proposed traffic calming measures in Bisham Village are signage with no engineering solutions.

AK believed that the proposals didn't take advantage of signage on the road itself.

GW asked if the new measures took the recent petition into account.

Cllr Brar highlighted that the proposal was "Plan A" and had been well received by the residents who set up the petition.

GW said he believed that measures didn't go far enough and a second speed survey would need to take place to evidence effectiveness.

One Member of the Public noted that HGVs were not deterred from coming into the village towards Marlow

Cllr Brar offered to speak to Highways to understand the options.

AK reported that there were leaves in the drains close to Town Farm.

#### 146. Parish Land

MRB thinks that Willow on the Slipway needs a further visit from the tree surgeon.

BM gave an update on the conversation with the Project Managers from the school construction site regarding the restitution of the Slipway.

GW gave an update on the quotes for the playground and noted that the climbing frame and the swing need replacing as soon as possible.

AK asked if the contractor needs to be a specialist. GW stated that the specialist surfaces involved required specific expertise.

GW proposed engaging HAGS to complete the playground works.

AK seconded

Cllrs agreed.

Future of Playground discussion to be held at a future meeting.

GW reported that there was debris in the stream towards the end of The Green. Cllr Brar confirmed that this had been reported.

GW noted that two trees need to be removed from the stream. CL confirmed that they would be removed the following week.

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JC, DO and AK reported on their walkabout on the Parish Land.

AK to forward the notes from the meeting.

AK doesn't believe that the Maintenance specification needs to change, but that a heavy-duty contractor may be needed for some actions.

### 147. Annual Parish Meeting

The Cllrs discussed the APM with the residents. The residents suggested that the meeting should be informative over entertaining.

Residents also suggested a door-to-door flyer drop to advertise the event.

BM suggested moving the APM to the end of May, which still fits in with the required timeframes.

#### 148. Jubilee

AK proposed supporting the residents' suggestion of a jubilee lunch. GW seconded Cllrs agreed.

#### 149. Expenses Policy

JC deferred the discussion to the April meeting.

#### 150. Flooding

Colin Lemmings (CL) reported that the approval on the flood plan had stalled and was still awaiting a response from RBWM.

DO suggested sending RBWM a deadline for a response, assuming no response to be acceptance.

CL reported that the flood boards would be replaced free of charge one more time.

### 151. Finance

BM gave an update on the year end accounts that would be completed after the end of march.

MRB reported that there was a tent/car covering in the garden of 1 Bisham Village and asked to look into the legality of the structure.

AK reported that he would be attending the jubilee event.
